## Test and Learn Sites: Primary Care Network Health Inequalities Plans – Priorities

The following data is taken from the Primary Care Network Health Inequalities Plans, where each PCN was asked to identify priority areas of focus around health inequality in their area.

How to read the tables and use the data:

- Each number shows the total number of PCNs in the locality that have identified that condition or group as a priority. For example, five PCNs in Manchester identified Diabetes as a priority, and one PCN in Manchester identified frailty as a priority. The final table shows where a PCN has identified a particular group that they feel is a priority due to health inequality. For example, in Oldham, the PCN for Milltown Alliance (West) has identified BAME Populations age 30-39 of age as a priority group.
- Note that this data is incomplete, as some areas have submitted limited data. This information is shared to support planning, but will not be used as the sole indicator of priority health inequalities for that PCN, when scoring bids.
